HOW TO LIVE YOUR LIFE WITH CONFIDENCE

Psalm 23

- 1 The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.
- 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside quiet waters.
- 3 He restores my soul; He guides me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.
- 4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.
- You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You have anointed my head with oil; my cup overflows.
- 6 Surely goodness and loving kindness will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

- 4. Look again at the places where you have marked "LORD". <u>Underline</u> the 6 settings *where* the LORD is our shepherd.
- 5. Who else is this Psalm about? Mark all references to the writer of the Psalm with circle. a
- 6. Put a box around verbs the or actions words to do with the LORD. What does he do for us?
- 7. What conclusion does the writer come to in verse 6?
